



SUMMER SCHOOL RULES - 2008/2009 SESSION

1. All University rules and regulations will remain in full force during the summer period. Consult your Handbook where in doubt.
2. 75% lecture attendance required to write any examination.
3. Grading for the Examination is as stated below:

Attendance	=	10%
Test & Assignment	=	20%
Summer examination	=	70%
4. Every student must carry the students ID Card and the Summer School Registration Clearance slip to lecture and examination halls.
5. Lectures and examination start by 8:00am and end by 10:00pm daily.
6. Only the College Verification Officers as identified below are authorized to register students for the Summer School. Their names and office addresses are:

7. Students who are still serving suspension terms are not allowed in the Summer School.
8. No Student is allowed to register more than 18 units.
9. Only failed courses are permitted in the Summer School. No new course registration will be allowed.
10. Students whose CGPA is below 1.5 are not permitted to participate except spillover students.



2009 SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAMME REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

1. Check for the number of failed courses and units from the University website @ www.covenantuniversity.com
2. Login to the college portal and select the number of units you intend to register subject to a maximum of 18 units.
3. Print out two copies of your submitted registration form
4. Calculate the total amount to be paid from the fee schedule
5. Proceed to any of the following designated banks to make payments
 - a. Covenant Microfinance Bank (**Acct. Name:** CU Account 1, **Acct No:** 15011)
 - b. Oceanic Bank (**Acct. Name:** CU Account 1, **Acct No:** 0161101005285)
6. On resumption show your bank teller at the University Chapel to get your accommodation.
7. All students for make-up examinations should check into the Halls of residence.
8. Proceed to the financial Services with your bank teller and obtain the University payment receipt.
9. Proceed to the college verification points for final clearance. This must be done before you are allowed to attend tutorials and sit for the Examination.
10. The Clearance slip admits you to the lecture halls and the examination venue.
11. Student should note that 75% attendance is required to qualify for the examinations in any of the courses registered.
12. Physical registration commences at the university chapel by 2.00 p.m. on Sunday, 19th July, 2009.
13. Lecture commences on 20th July, 2009. **Note:** Lecture time table are already posted on the notice boards.
14. Registration ends on Friday 24th July, 2009 by 5.00pm. No late registration will be accommodated.
